What is Hate Crime?

Hate crimes and hate incidents include any behaviour that is targeted at a person or group of people because of hostility or prejudice towards them. Safe and Sound (Dudley's community safety partnership) is committed to tackling hate crime and prejudices leading to hate crime and incidents.

A crime or incident is classed as 'hate' crime or incident if the person the act is aimed at, or a person witnessing the act, believes it to be because of any of the below actual or perceived characteristics of the victim.

- ***race or ethnicity***
- ***religion or belief***
- ***sexual orientation***
- ***gender identity***
- ***disability***

A victim of a hate crime/ incident does not have to be a member of a minority group or someone who is generally considered to be vulnerable. Effectively anyone can be the victim of a hate incident.

Incidents may involve physical assault, damage to property, bullying, harassment, verbal abuse or insults, offensive graffiti or letters /text messages emails/ comments over social networks.

Remedi

The 'Remedi' Hate Crime Victim Service provides **all** victims and witnesses of hate crime and hate incidents in Dudley with short-term or long-term emotional and practical support to enable them to cope and recover from the offence.

The service operates to be as flexible as possible for the victim, providing support face to face, online or over the phone. A dedicated support worker will build a support plan with the victim or witnesses to address the needs they may have as a result of the offence. This may include signposting and referrals to other agencies, advocacy, assistance with victim personal statements, emotional and practical support, support at court or providing personal security items.
